# The Forty-Sixth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 15, 2016 Bismarck, North Dakota

The Forty-Sixth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota was called to order with opening prayers led by the Rt. Rev. Michael Smith, Bishop of North Dakota, at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 15, 2016, at the Radisson Hotel in Bismarck.

Bishop called on the Rev. James Shannon (St. Paul's, Grand Forks), Dispatch of Business. He read a letter from the Bishop of Texas.

Resolution to send three clergy and three lay delegates to General Convention in 2018.

**Resolved**, the Diocese of North Dakota send three (3) lay deputies and three (3) clergy deputies to the General Convention of the Episcopal Church of the United States.

The Rev. John Floberg (Standing Rock) presented an amendment:

To send four lay and four clergy deputies to the General Convention of the Episcopal Church of the United States.

Motion passed with amendment.

Christie Iverson was elected to Standing Committee - Lay. The following were elected as deputies to General Convention in 2018 (listed in rank order).

Pat Fearing (All Saints', Valley City), United Thank Offering (UTO) co-coordinator, was called on to give the annual report. Matthew Martinez (St. James', Cannon Ball) and Patrick Kelly (St. James', Cannon Ball) were introduced as the new co-coordinators of UTO.

Charlotte Robbins (Gethsemane, Fargo) and Erica Morlan (Gethsemane, Fargo) for Episcopal Relief & Development (ERD) were called to give their annual report. They asked that this year's ERD collection go to Hurricane Relief.

Mary Johnson (All Saints', Minot) presented Resolution #2

**Resolved**, that the 46th Annual Convention of the Diocese of North Dakota directs the Bishop and Diocesan Council to appoint a committee to seek areas of cooperation and collaboration with the Diocese of South Dakota and to explore the possibilities of a juncture of the two Dioceses;

**Resolved**, that a copy of this resolution be submitted to the Bishop and Diocesan council of the Diocese of South Dakota; and be it further

**Resolved**, that the committee be directed to report their findings to the 47th Annual Convention of the Diocese of North Dakota.

Discussion of Resolution. Consideration of Resolution delayed until the afternoon.

Rooms were announced for East and West regional meetings to be held at 1 o'clock, following lunch.

Convention business adjourned temporarily in order to travel to St. George's for the convention Eucharist.

Following the convention Eucharist, lunch, and the regional meetings, the convention reconvened for the afternoon's business.

Elections for Diocesan Council from the regional meetings were:

West: Kristin Koch (St. George's, Bismarck) and Brandon Mauai

John Baird (St. Stephen's, Fargo) was elected President for the East Region.

Resumed consideration of Resolution #2. Bart Davis (Grace Church, Jamestown) proposed an amendment: To direct the Standing Committee (removing Bishop and Diocesan Council) to appoint a committee.

Seconded, passed. Vote on Resolution, passed.

The Bishop called on Charlotte Peterson (St. Paul's, Grand Forks), treasurer for the diocese, to present the 2017 budget. Discussion followed. Floberg explained the Sustainability Grant. Floberg moved to approve. Second, approved.

Bishop recognized Davis for his 20 years of service to the Diocese. He was presented with sincere thanks from the diocese and a blanket.

The Bishop referred to the sheet in packets appointing various Committees of the Diocese. Leslie Ross (St. John's, Dickinson) moved, seconded to approve Bishop's appointment to Disciplinary Board. Approved

Johnson reported on the ND Episcopal Foundation grants available and encouraged congregations to apply.

Terry Overbo (Gethsemane, Fargo) reported on the Acolyte Festival to be held at Gethsemane Cathedral, Fargo the weekend on November 18-20, 2016.

The Bishop asked Johnson to present the courtesy resolutions – they are as follows:

**Therefore, be it Resolved** that members of the 46th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese convey to the Henleys our prayers for Chuck's speedy and complete recovery.

**Whereas,** the Rt. Rev. Andrew Doyle, the Bishop of our companion Diocese, the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, conveyed his greetings and encouragement to Episcopalians of North Dakota;

**Therefore, be it Resolved** that the 46th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota express its gratitude and pledge its prayers for the wellbeing and effective ministry of the Diocese of Texas.

**Whereas**, the Diocese of North Dakota is pleased, on the 10th anniversary of the relationship between St. Thomas Episcopal Church on Spirit Lake Nation (Fort Totten) and Trinity Episcopal Church in The Woodlands, Texas;

**Therefore, be it Resolved** by this 46th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota that we are deeply thankful for the achievements resulting from this relationship of trust and partnership between the two churches, a partnership with shared common goals and shared strengths; and

**Be it further Resolved** that the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota hopes to see this relationship be an example to others as we partner together in mission.

Whereas, the dioceses of North and South Dakota share in many ministries offered to the glory of God; and Whereas, the 46th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota has begun to consider the uniting of our two dioceses into one;

**Therefore, be it Resolved** that the 46th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota welcomes The Rt. Rev. John Tarrant, as the representative of the people and ministries of the Diocese of South Dakota, and expresses our thanks for his presence, asking God's blessing on our shared ministry.

**Therefore, be it Resolved** by this 46th Convention of the Episcopal Church of the Diocese of North Dakota that we pledge our prayers for Haiti, both as the nation recovers from the ravages of Hurricane Matthew, and for the work of the Episcopal Church in parishes, schools and universities and especially at St. Barnabas Agricultural College, as they continue their important work; and

**Be it further Resolved** that the 46th Convention of the Diocese of North Dakota prayerfully consider supporting the work of the Dioceses of Haiti with our talents and financial resources, and by joining Bishop Michael Smith on a trip to learn from and share with the people of Haiti.

The Bishop announced that next year's convention will be held at the Radisson in Bismarck on October 20-21, 2017.

Elsie Magnus (St. Peter's, Walhalla) donated a basket of jams, jellies and pickles for a silent auction with proceeds going to Haiti. Duffy Williams (Gethsemane, Fargo) was the high bidder. Thank you, Elsie.

The Bishop asked for a motion to adjourn the convention. A motion was made, seconded and passed to adjourn the 2016 Annual Convention at 2:42 p.m. and the convention concluded with a prayer offered by the Bishop.

2017 Budget Proposal and 2016 Treasurer's Report Presented to Diocesan Convention Bismarck, October 14-15, 2016

#### **NOTES & EXPLANATIONS FOR THE 2017 BUDGET**

Chairs of committees appointed by Bishop Michael at the last Diocesan Convention were asked to submit 2017 budget requests. Amounts as requested were inserted into the 2017 Working Budget. Other budget figures are a result of Diocesan policy, input from Bishop Michael, 2015 actual and 2016 estimated expenditures, and projected cost figures gathered from other sources. The proposed budget represents recommendations made by the Finance Committee and approved by Diocesan Council.

#### A few items to note:

Bishop Michael will be working quarter-time with the Diocese of Dallas in 2017. His salary and benefits are shown at full-time with income from the Diocese of Dallas on line 7, similar to when he worked for Louisiana and the Cathedral. The income on line 7 will be excluded from the Episcopal Church Program asking formula.

NDCIM: The NDCIM budget (highlighted in grey) is funded by the General Convention grant for Native American Ministry. The total of this grant for 2017 is \$181,333. In order to continue receiving these grants, the Diocese must ensure the grant funds are spent on Native American Ministry. These expenses must be equal to or greater than the funds received.

Trust & Endowment Fund Transfers (Line 3): We have drawn only \$50,000 of the budgeted amount from our investments so far this year. This is because our cash flow has remained steady due to the Royalty Income, the General Convention Grant, and Our Fair Share (OFS) payments. We do expect to draw at least another \$50,000 by the end of the year.

Bakken Ministry Funds: The Diocese owns several mineral rights in the Bakken. At the beginning of 2014, the Diocesan Council created the Bakken Ministry reserve fund. Monies in this fund are a result of bonus payments from mineral leases and royalty income received above the budgeted amount. The Diocesan Council has ear-marked this money to be used for ministry in the oil fields. Specifically, to assist St. John's, Dickinson, in their partnership with a Lutheran pastor (\$10,000 annually through August 2017) and to pay utilities, insurance and mortgage interest related to the rectory purchased by the Diocese for St. Peter's, Williston.

Following are notes/comments to provide additional information about some of the proposed budget items:

# **INCOME**

<u>Line 2 - Our Fair Share</u>: It is recommended that OFS percent remain the same in 2017 as in previous years at 20%. Calculation for OFS is as follows:

Actual Prior Year End (2015) / Prior Year Percent (2015 was 20%) X Budget Percent (20%). \$237,674 / 20% = \$1,188,370 X 20% = \$237,674

<u>Line 3 – Trust & Endowment Fund Transfers</u>: Since 1996, we have been using a three-year moving average method to determine the amount available for draw per our Spending Policy. At the November, 2015, Council meeting we discussed that a portion of the Trust and Endowment Fund is committed to Designated Funds which are listed in the Operating Fund. In recognition of this, we started showing the dollar amount committed to Designated Funds on the Balance Sheet. At its August 2016 meeting, the Diocesan Council updated the Trust & Endowment Fund spending policy to reflect this change. While we continue to use the three-year moving average method, the way we calculate the year-end balance of Trust & Endowment Fund has changed. The formula for calculating the year-end balance available for draw is as follows:

Year-end Trust & Endowment Fund balance minus funds committed to designated funds.

The year-end balances with the new formula are \$2,526,178.18, \$2,552,049.91 and \$2,289,234.86 respectively for a three-year moving average of \$2,455,820.98. The new formula lowers our dollar amount available for draw and therefore increases our percentage of draw, but is more transparent. Below are income figures per percentage:

The proposed budget shows a draw of 5.5% using the new method.

<u>Line 5 - General Convention Grant:</u> The Diocese will receive \$181,333 per year for the triennium (2016-2018) for Native American Ministry. This was passed at General Convention in 2015.

<u>Line 7 - Bishop's Additional Employment:</u> From the Diocese of Dallas.

<u>Line 8 - From Designated Funds:</u> Includes \$16,000 from Bakken Ministry reserve to offset utilities, insurance and mortgage interest related to the Williston Rectory (Line 169), \$9,000 from Sudanese Ministry reserve fund to offset Line 40 (Sudanese Ministry) and \$7,000 from Bakken Ministry reserve to offset the partnership with St. John's, Dickinson (Line 154).

<u>Line 10 - Sheaf Donations:</u> Based on prior years actual donations.

<u>Line 11 - Youth Program Income:</u> None expected.

<u>Line 12 – Convention/Event Income</u>: Registrations for Diocesan Convention and Clergy/Ministers Conferences.

<u>Line 13 - Royalty Income</u>: Income from our producing wells in the Bakken. \$13,000 is based on actual royalty payments received from April 2015-April 2016.

<u>Line 14 – Tribal Campus Ministry Grant:</u> None expected. The grant was for 2015-2016.

#### **EXPENDITURES**

<u>Line 20 - Episcopal Church Program:</u> At the last General Convention, the Episcopal Church funding formula changed. In 2017, dioceses are asked to pay 16.5% (down from 18% in 2016) of net operating income earned two years prior to the budget year with the first \$150,000 exempt (previously was 19%, with the first \$120,000 exempt). The \$181,000 General Convention grant is also exempt. The Episcopal Church will be reducing the amount asked of dioceses over the triennium to 15% by 2018. To fulfill the 16.5% asked, the budget figure will be \$42,336, which is less than the current year.

<u>Line 21 - General Convention Deputies:</u> The next General Convention will be held in 2018 in Austin, Texas. Cost of the 2015 General Convention was approximately \$20,000 to send 3 clergy delegates and 3 lay delegates. To ensure there is enough in the reserve to send 4 and 4 we need to budget \$8,000 each year for 3 years (2016-2018). (The bishop's GC expenses will come out of his travel expense.)

Line 22 - Province VI Assessment: An assessment that is paid to Province VI quarterly.

<u>Line 23 - Province VI Synod Delegates:</u> Provincial Synod will now take place every 3 years, the same as General Convention. To make sure there is enough to send 4 delegates every 3 years, there should be \$4,000 in the reserve fund by 2018. As of the April 2016, there is just under \$4,000. We budgeted \$0 for 2017; however the line item will be kept in the budget for future use.

<u>Line 24 - Lambeth Conference:</u> Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund to pay the expenses of the bishop's and spouse's attendance at Lambeth Conference, which meets every ten years.

<u>Line 25 – EDEIO (Ecumenical and Interreligious Officers):</u> This line item was renamed from the ND Conference of Churches which has disbanded. The Diocese is now part of EDEIO (Episcopal Diocesan Ecumenical and Interreligious Officers) with annual dues of \$250. Mary Johnson is the appointed Diocesan representative.

<u>Lines 28-46 - Programs & Outreach:</u> The program and outreach line items reflect mostly what was requested by the committees with a few adjustments made.

<u>Line 40 - Sudanese Ministry</u>: Increased from \$8,000 to \$15,000 to reflect actual expenses. This is not an increase in support from the budget. The additional \$7,000 will come from the designated fund. To ensure transparency, we are showing the entire dollar amount of support.

<u>Line 41 - East African Mission:</u> Decreased from \$5,000 to \$2,500 (same as 2016).

Line 44 - Haiti Mission: Support for a new mission led by Andrea Stomberg from St. George's.

<u>Lines 48-148 - Salary & Benefits:</u> Salaries and stipends are based on step (.25%) increase. As of April 2016, the Consumer Price Index shows COLA at 0%.

Family medical/dental/vision insurance and a \$25,000 term life insurance policy are provided for the bishop, clergy employed by the diocese, and diocesan office staff. The Episcopal Church Medical Trust will not have 2017 premiums available until mid-September. The premiums in the 2017 proposed budget represent a 5.5% increase from. Life insurance premiums remain the same. The Employee Assistance Program (EAP) is a confidential counseling service offered to employees and non-stipendiary clergy.

<u>Lines 57-62 - Episcopate Program Expenses:</u> Note: Any remainder from Line 60 (Travel Expense) will be transferred to Diocesan Car Reserve at end of year. Finance Committee made the following adjustments:

<u>Line 58 - Episcopate Business Hospitality:</u> Decreased by ¼ from \$2,000 to \$1,500.

<u>Line 60 - Episcopate Travel Expense:</u> Decreased by ¼ from \$20,000 to \$15,000.

<u>Lines 67-85 – Sustainability Grant Implementation and Standing Rock Rector</u>: Renamed from Canon Missioner Central and Canon Missioner NDCIM. The Rev. John Floberg has left the Bishop's staff as a Canon Missioner so he can better focus on the three Standing Rock congregations and on the implementation of the new Sustainability Grants.

Line 93 – Canon Missioner East Travel: Decreased from \$2,800 to \$2,550.

<u>Lines 94 and 102 – Canon Missioner Continuing Ed:</u> Diocesan Council voted that any annual unused portion of continuing education money for diocesan-employed clergy can be put into the Masuda Fund (designated for the individual clergy's use).

#### Lines 150-162 - Other Congregational Support

<u>Line 151 - Move/Interview Mission Clergy:</u> Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund to be used to help newly-hired clergy move into the diocese.

<u>Line 152 - Indian Property Repairs:</u> Part of the NDCIM budget. NDCIM has designated \$8,000 for St. Paul's, White Shield, and \$8,000 for St. Sylvan's, Dunseith.

<u>Line 153 – Bismarck Rectory House Insurance/Repairs:</u> Annual insurance premium of \$2,781 and \$800 for repairs to the rectory in Bismarck. 75% to come from NDCIM budget.

<u>Line 154 – Dickinson:</u> To assist St. John's, Dickinson, in their partnership with a Lutheran pastor (\$10,000 annually through August 2017).

<u>Line 155 – Williston (St. Peter's Rectory)</u>: \$3,078 annual insurance premium, \$1,922 utilities, and \$11,000 mortgage interest. (Offset is line 8, to come from Bakken Ministry Fund.)

<u>Lines 156-162 - Indian Property Insurance:</u> The figures are the actual 2017 premium amount as provided by Church Insurance. Part of the NDCIM budget.

#### Lines 165-196 - Administrative Expenses

Lines 166-172 - NDCIM General Expenses: Part of the NDCIM budget.

# <u>Lines 174-178 - Administrative Meetings:</u>

Line 175 - Convention: The proposed budget amount is the actual cost of last year's convention.

<u>Line 176 - Diocesan Council/Standing Committee:</u> The proposed budget amount is based on the cost of Diocesan Council/Standing Committee meetings in 2015 and so far in 2016. Costs include hotel, mileage and meals for three meetings per year plus Council members' rooms at Diocesan Convention.

<u>Line 177 - Other Administrative Meetings:</u> Budget for finance and other committee meetings.

<u>Lines 180-195 - Office Expenses, Insurance and Misc:</u> Includes office supplies, postage, internet, copy machine, etc. Proposed budget amounts are based on actual 2015 and so far in 2016.

<u>Line 182 – Equipment/Maintenance</u>: Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund for office equipment and software. The accounting software used has a yearly maintenance/update/security subscription of \$1,300.

<u>Lines 189-190 – Insurance:</u> Figures in the 2017 proposed budget are actual amounts of premiums provided by Church Insurance.

Line 195 – Interest Expense: This figure represents the mortgage interest for the Rectory in Bismarck.

#### **2015 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS**

**2015** Income & Expense vs. Budget: We ended the year with a net loss of \$22,240.39.

- Our actual draw (factoring in the use of designated/restricted funds as cash flow) was 5.8%. If we had taken an additional withdrawal from the Endowment to cover the shortfall of \$22,240, our draw would have been 6.75%, the budgeted draw. As we ended the year with a checking account balance of \$78,566, there was not the need to take an additional withdrawal.
- Some of this loss was expected:
  - \$5144 in mortgage interest expense (line 209 Bismarck property) as we sought to be more transparent, listing the expense rather than having it handled by auditor's adjustment at the time of the audit. (This was decided by Council at the August, 2014, meeting.)
  - o \$7075 shortfall in Royalty income (line 13).

**Investments:** The Diocesan investment portion of the Pooled Investment Fund (PIF) as of December 31, 2015, was \$2,570,634. Of this dollar amount, \$281,400 (as of 12-31-15), is committed to operating fund (designated funds). As a comparison, the market value at year end over the past ten years has been:

# 2016 Income & Expense vs. Budget

- *Income:* As of August 31, the Diocese has received \$110,174 in Our Fair Share (OFS), which is 47% of budget. This amount is down 2% from last year at this time. Our cash flow has remained steady due to the Royalty Income, the General Convention Grant, and OFS payments. Due to these reasons, we have transferred only 27% (\$50,000) of our 2016 budgeted amount from investments. A few items to note:
  - o From Designated Funds (Line 8) includes offset from Bakken Ministry Fund for Williston rectory utilities and mortgage interest (Line 167) as well as for Sudanese Ministry (Line 40).
- **Expenses:** Most expenses are moving right on track as budgeted (at or around 66.67% of budget). A few items to note:
  - o Bishop Michael has used his continuing education budget (Line 54)
  - o John Floberg used his continuing education budget for his sabbatical (Lines 74 and 84).
  - o Indian Property Repairs (Line 152) has been fully utilized. All repair and/or construction projects have been halted until more funds are available.
  - Williston (St. Peter's Rectory) (Line 155) is for utilities and mortgage interest. The offset account for this
    expense is From Designated Funds (Line 8, specifically from Bakken Ministry).
  - Real Estate Tax (Line 193) includes new special assessments for the Rectory in Bismarck. These are for street improvements and were to be assessed over seven years beginning in February, 2016. Diocesan Council voted via email to pay-off the specials, which has been done.

# **Liabilities & Net Assets (Balance Sheet)**

- **Operating Fund:** The operating fund shows the various unrestricted designated and temporarily restricted fund balances (see pages 17-19 for specific fund descriptions). Some of these have no activity through the year and others have a number of transactions.
- **Grants Received:** North Dakota has been awarded three Sustainability Grants by the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church: youth ministry (for North and South Dakota, to be administered by North Dakota), \$630,000; solar panels, \$45,000; excavator (backhoe) for Standing Rock Reservation, North and South Dakota (to be administered by North Dakota), \$28,000. North Dakota received a United Thank Offering grant for solar panels, \$50,000.

#### • Trust & Endowment Fund:

- o Pooled Investment Fund: The Pooled Investment Fund (PIF) consists of investments from the Diocese, the North Dakota Episcopal Foundation, Gethsemane Cathedral Foundation, and St. Stephen's.
- The PIF Investment Committee members are Leo Wilking (Acting Chair), Bart Davis, John Floberg, Chris Golding and John Baird. For information about joining the PIF, contact a committee member or visit the Diocesan website at http://www.ndepiscopal.org/documents-and-forms/pooled-investment-fund/.

The Diocesan investment portion of the PIF as of August 31, 2016, was \$2,670,977. Of this dollar amount, \$370,133 is committed to the operating fund (designated funds).

We owe \$78,927 on the Rectory in Bismarck and \$229,563 on the Williston Rectory. There are two congregations who have outstanding loans from the diocese: (1) St. Peter's, Walhalla, with a balance of \$2,853, and (2) Advent, Devils Lake, with a balance of \$22,119. Advent makes monthly payments. St. Peter's has been unable to make a payment since 2012. Diocesan Council voted to write-off the St. Peter's loan, which will be done during year-end close.

# Bishop's Sermon To the Forty-sixth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 15, 2016

Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven (Matthew 5:15).

Today we are reminded by the words of Jesus to let our lights shine before others. Why? So they can see how good we are compared to them? No, so that others may see our good works and give glory to our Father in heaven. It's not about how good we are; it's about how great God is!

In fact, we are not even given credit for the good we think we do. It's all because of the grace of God, the life of God working through us, the unmerited favor God gives us as a gift. I've been inspired this week by the Collect we used last Sunday when we prayed for the Lord's grace to "precede and follow us, that we may continually be given to good works" (Proper 23). That's a wonderful thought, is it not? That God goes out in front of us and also follows behind us, working out the divine purpose in our lives. It is a pattern that worked itself out in the life of Teresa of Avila whom we commemorate today.

A remarkable woman of sixteenth century Spain, Teresa is one of only four women declared by the Church of Rome as a "doctor of the church." She is remembered as a reformer and contemplative nun whose writings are read as aids to the spiritual life by many Christians of all denominations.

Some of her better known quotes include:

"Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing frighten you. Everything passes away except God."

And I really like this one:

"God save us from gloomy saints!"

She also had a sense of humor: Once, when she was travelling, Teresa was knocked off her donkey and fell into the mud, injuring her leg. "Lord," she said, "you couldn't have picked a worse time for this to happen. If this is how you treat your friends, then no wonder you have so few."

Yes, Teresa let her light shine before others so that they could see her good works and give glory to her Father in heaven. How have we as the Diocese of North Dakota been allowing our light to shine? A quick read of last year's issues of our newsletter, The Sheaf, provides some answers.

- We have learned about and blanketed the state with anti-human trafficking brochures.
- All Saints in Minot has brought to our attention the environmental encyclical of Pope Francis, On Care for our Common Home.
- Bible studies have begun at Ss. Mary & Mark's in Oakes, and at St. Michael's in Cartwright.
- •Inspired by the Piece-makers of St. George's in Bismarck, a sewing circle at St. Peter's in Williston is making pillow cases for local nursing homes and shelters. St. Peter's is also sponsoring Community Dinners where all are welcome and reaching out to the people of Ray.
- A successful Acolyte Festival was held at the Cathedral with plans to repeat and to expand to Minot this spring.
- A new Deacon Formation Program has begun with twelve individuals at various levels of discernment, and a renewed emphasis on licensed lay ministries and the North Dakota School for Ministry.
- We have begun monthly "Clergy Days" to incorporate the significant number of new clergy into our fellowship.
- Work on the "tiny house" project continues on Standing Rock, funded by the United Thank Offering.
- •Ed Wos was ordained as a deacon.
- •St. John's in Dickinson has experimented with the concept of a "House Church" and other fellowship ministries such as "Beer and Hymns."

- The new ministry known as "Bread of Life" at Ministry on the Margins continues to grow in Bismarck.
- The East African Scholarship and Guatemala Medical missions continued their good work, and vision to support new work in Haiti has begun.
- With grateful hearts for a job well done, we said goodbye to Father Neil Two Bears of Cannon Ball who died in February.
- •St. Stephen's in Fargo blessed seeds and garden implements on Rogation Sunday and dedicated new stained glass windows.
- •St. George's in Bismarck unveiled a five-year strategic plan.
- Gethsemane Cathedral has begun a year of observances in conjunction with the heritage-edition of the St. John's Bible.

Good works, all. Thank you, Lord, for preceding and following us in these good works done for the glory of your Name.

As you know, last August the North Dakota Council on Indian Ministries issued a statement in solidarity of support for our brothers and sisters at Standing Rock in opposition to the Dakota Access Pipeline because of potential dangers to their drinking water as well as degradation of sacred sites. This statement in turn was endorsed unanimously by our Diocesan Council.

Our goal in doing so was not to politicize the diocese or to even engage in debate about what is the safest method of transportation of oil. It came about, rather, as a result of listening to people we have relationships with in this church, people we have come to know and love over the years, family members with whom we are related through the waters of baptism. These are deep bonds indeed. To paraphrase St. Paul: "If one of us suffers, we all suffer; if one of us is honored, we all rejoice" (1 Cor. 12:26).

As the chief shepherd of this "goodly fellowship" we know as the Diocese of North Dakota, I have come to believe that one of our unique charisms is the racial diversity with which we have been blessed. But with that blessing comes a serious responsibility and privilege to serve as reconcilers in the communities in which we find ourselves.

In my opinion, the current pipeline controversy we see about us is not just about oil or even the environment for that matter, as important as those things may be. Rather, for us as members of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota, it is about our relationships with our brothers and sisters and our neighbors and how we as disciples of Jesus Christ are called to engage in the ministry of reconciliation.

I was raised with the saying that "sometimes you need to believe nothing of what you hear, and only half of what you see." We may be in one of those times.

In the House of Bishops we have covenanted with each other to "pick up the phone and call" a bishop rumored to have said or done something hurtful or inappropriate. And you know what, it works. Usually the rumor turns out to be false or the words or actions have been misinterpreted.

Rumors are rampant in this season. Words escalate the situation. Suspicions are raised. Motives are questioned. But things are not always as they seem. So I ask you to please check out any troubling reports you might hear with people we know, with Rosa or Carmine or Brandon or Angela or Johanna or Matthew or Patrick or Ethan or Florestine or Elaine or Lila. We know their names. These are our brothers and sisters at Standing Rock and they will tell us the truth about the facts on the ground. We owe that much to one another having become relatives through the waters of baptism and having shared the body and blood of Christ together at the table of the Lord.

One crucially important thing for us all to remember is that our children are watching and listening. They long to hear words of reconciliation and to see acts of healing from us.

Listen to these words of wisdom from our saint of the day:

"Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours."
